## Safety

- **SAFETY:** Safety is the #1 priority. You will need to fill out a medical release, concussion consent, and a parent code of conduct prior to practices begin.
- Please ensure your child follows all the rules set by your coach and pays attention both on and off the field.
- The Zackery Lystedt Law, <u>requires medical clearance</u> of youth athletes suspected of sustaining a concussion, before sending them back in the game, practice or training.



## Volunteers – Your coach needs you

- **Volunteers:** While coaches play a big part of running a team, they are not the only positions needed to effectively run a team. We ask that each team have a team have volunteers for each of the following positions:
- **Team Parent** To assist the coach with tasks like snack schedule, "Little League Day with the Mariners" and any addition team coordination.
- Bench/Dugout Parent It is very difficult for coaches to effectively coach and manage kids in the dugout. This parent would help keep kids in their batting order and ensure the safety of all players.
- Assistant Coaches In an ideal situation each team would have an additional 2-4 assistant coaches to assist as base coaches, pitcher, batting helper, fielding helper.



### Volunteers

- Volunteer Registration If you are interested in helping it is required that you register at SVLL.net, just like you register your child. Unregistered parents are not allowed to be on the field or in the dugout areas.
- Volunteer Matching Also note, if you volunteer and work for a company (such as Microsoft, Amazon, T-Mobile or others) that pay for volunteer hours, those hours count as volunteering (SVLL is a 501c3)! Please contact our treasurer (me!) for more info on how to register your hours.

#### When and where do we meet our coach and team?

Our first practice will be the week of April 16. Your coaches have received their rosters and will be reaching out to their teams with a practice schedule very soon.

### What equipment will my child need?

The league will provide bats, batting helmets and balls. Players will need to provide a mitt, cleats, and black baseball pants. If your player would like to use their own equipment it must meet the Little League requirements. Please note, there is a new rule for bats since 2018- all bats must have a USA Baseball sticker.

### When and where are practices/games?

All games and practices are played at various parks around Snoqualmie Valley.

Tee Ball (League Age 5) – Tuesdays and Thursdays Sluggers (League Age 6) – Tuesdays and Thursdays and some Saturdays "A" (League Age 7) – Monday, Wednesday, and most Saturdays



• What is the Rain out Policy?- we follow the closure set by Si View Parks. They will update their page by 3pm on weekdays and 8am on weekends. Rained out games/practices are cancelled and will not be made up.
